ELT and online video Jamie Keddie

As YouTube celebrates its fifth birthday, online video continues to affect the world in diverse and unpredictable ways. In this video-enhanced, practical talk, we will explore issues such as:

- How is the emergence of this new medium affecting the ELT community in general? For teachers, what does online video offer that traditional video didn't?
- How can we use online video to teach language?
- When using online video in the classroom, what are the key technical competences that language teachers require?
- How should publishers and materials developers react and adapt to the prominence of and interest in this new medium?

Jamie Keddie is a European-based teacher, teacher trainer and writer. In 2008, he founded TEFLclips, a site dedicated to the possibilities for online video-sharing in the classroom. For this, he received a British Council Innovations award in 2009. His publications include Images in the in the Resource Books for Teachers series published by Oxford University Press. Jamie is a teacher trainer at Norwich Institute for Language Education.
